Infants 0-12 months

Recognizes your face and scent holds head steady visually tracks moving objects: **Always Sometimes Never**

Squeals, gurgles, coos, blows bubbles recognizes your voice does mini-pushup: **Always Sometimes Never**

Can grasp a toy, rolls over, from tummy to back: **Always Sometimes Never**

Recognizes own name, turns toward new sounds, rolls over in both directions: **Always Sometimes Never**

Sits without support, drags objects toward themselves: **Always Sometimes Never**

Says "mama" or "dada" to parents (isn't specific) passes objects from hand to hand: **Always Sometimes Never**

Toddlers 13-24 months

Uses two words skillfully (e.g., "hi" and "bye") bends over and picks up an object: **Always Sometimes Never**

Eats with fingers, empties containers of contents, Imitates others: **Always Sometimes Never**

Plays with ball, uses three words regularly, walks backward: **Always Sometimes Never**

Turns the pages of a book, becomes attached to a soft toy or other object: **Always Sometimes Never**

Uses six words regularly, enjoys pretend games, likes riding toys: **Always Sometimes Never**

Will "read" board books on his own, scribbles well: **Always Sometimes Never**

Uses a spoon and fork , runs, throws a ball underhand, enjoys helping around the house: **Always Sometimes Never**

Learns words at a rate of ten or more a day: **Always Sometimes Never**

Can walk up stairs, able to set simple goals (deciding to put a toy in a certain place): **Always Sometimes Never**

Names at least six body parts, makes two- to three-word sentences: **Always Sometimes Never**

Two year old 25-36 months

Stacks six blocks, walks with smooth heel-to-toe motion: **Always Sometimes Never**

Jumps with both feet, opens doors: **Always Sometimes Never**

Brushes teeth with help, washes and dries own hands, draws a vertical line: **Always Sometimes Never**

Recites own name, draws a circle: **Always Sometimes Never**

Names one color, names one friend, carries on a simple conversation: **Always Sometimes Never**

Balances on each foot for three seconds, gets dressed without help: **Always Sometimes Never**

Hops and skips, follows a two- or three-part command: **Always Sometimes Never**
